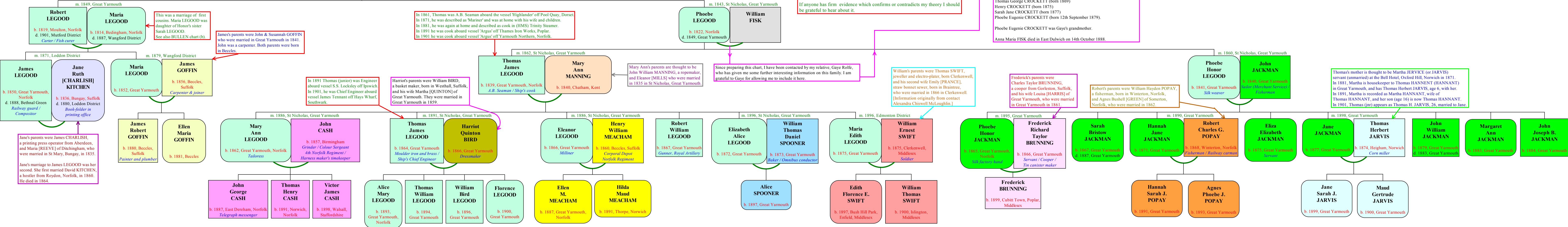
**Honor LEGOOD**  
b. 1796, Bedingham, Norfolk  
d. 1866, Great Yarmouth  
*Nurse*

The evidence for this family is a bit thin. Honor is recorded in the 1841 census (see HO107-794-2-33-14) at Walls, Great Yarmouth: Honor LEGGET (45), Robert LEGGET (20, labourer), Phoebe LEGGETT (18), Thomas LEGGETT (2). This looks like mother, son and daughter (or daughter in law), and grandson, but, the 1841 census did not record relationships.

In the 1851 census (HO107-1806-238-15) at So Walls, Great Yarmouth there is:  
Robert LEGOOD (Head, 30, Carter, born Moulton),  
Maria LEGOOD (Wife, 36, b. Bedingham),  
James LEGOOD (Son, 1, b. Yarmouth),  
Honor LEGOOD (Mother, single, 54, b. Bedingham),  
Thomas LEGOOD (Nephew, 11, b. Yarmouth).

From this I have concluded that Phoebe is Robert's sister (or half-sister), and that Thomas is Phoebe's natural son.  
  
The evidence for Phoebe Honor LEGOOD being another natural child of Phoebe is very thin. In fact, I haven't got anything apart from the fact that she was born in Great Yarmouth just 2 years after Thomas, and that her name is Phoebe Honor.  
  
If anyone has firm evidence which confirms or contradicts my theory I should be grateful to hear about it.

William and Phoebe had a child before Phoebe's death in 1849. The child was Anna Maria FISK who was born on 3rd January 1848, in Great Yarmouth. Anna remained with the FISK family after her mother died.  
  
At the age of 20, Anna was married to George Thomas CROCKETT in St James, Muswell Hill, on 25th February 1868. George was a gardener on an estate. George and Anna had four surviving children who were:  
  
Thomas George CROCKETT (born 1869)  
Henry CROCKETT (born 1875)  
Sarah Jane CROCKETT (born 1877)  
Phoebe Eugenie CROCKETT (born 12th September 1879).  
  
Phoebe Eugenie CROCKETT was Gaye's grandmother.  
  
Anna Maria FISK died in East Dulwich on 14th October 1888.



Jane's parents were James CHARLISH, a printing press operator from Aberdeen, and Maria [REEVE] of Ditchingham, who were married in St Mary, Bungay, in 1835.  
  
Jane's marriage to James LEGOOD was her second. She first married David KITCHEN, a hostler from Roydon, Norfolk, in 1860. He died in 1864.

This was a marriage of first cousins. Maria LEGOOD was daughter of Honor's sister Sarah LEGOOD. See also BULLEN chart (b).

James's parents were John & Susannah GOFFIN who were married in Great Yarmouth in 1841. John was a carpenter. Both parents were born in Beccles.

In 1861, Thomas was A.B. Seaman aboard the vessel 'Highlander' off Pool Quay, Dorset. In 1871, he was described as 'Mariner' and was at home with his wife and children. In 1881, he was again at home and described as cook in (HMS) Trinity Steamer. In 1891 he was cook aboard vessel 'Argus' off Thames Iron Works, Poplar. In 1901 he was cook aboard vessel 'Argus' off Yarmouth Northern, Norfolk.

In 1891 Thomas (junior) was Engineer aboard vessel S.S. Locksley off Ipswich. In 1901, he was Chief Engineer aboard vessel James Tennant off Hays Wharf, Southwark.

Harriot's parents were William BIRD, a basket maker, born in Westhall, Suffolk, and his wife Martha [QUINTON] of Great Yarmouth. They were married in Great Yarmouth in 1859.

Mary Ann's parents are thought to be John William MANNING, a ropemaker, and Eleanor [MILLS] who were married in 1835 in St Nicholas, Great Yarmouth.

Since preparing this chart, I have been contacted by my relative, Gaye Rolfe, who has given me some further interesting information on this family. I am grateful to Gaye for allowing me to include it here.

William's parents were Thomas SWIFT, jeweller and electro-plater, born Clerkenwell, and his second wife Emily [PRANCE], straw bonnet sewer, born in Braintree, who were married in 1866 in Clerkenwell. [Information originally from contact Alexandra Chiswell McLoughlin.]

Frederick's parents were Charles Taylor BRUNNING, a cooper from Gorleston, Suffolk, and his wife Louisa [HARRIS] of Great Yarmouth, who were married in Great Yarmouth in 1861.

Robert's parents were William Hayden POPAY, a fisherman, born in Winterton, Norfolk, and Agnes Bushell [GREEN] of Somerton, Norfolk, who were married in 1862.

Thomas's mother is thought to be Martha JERVICE (or JARVIS) servant (unmarried) at the Bell Hotel, Oxford Hill, Norwich in 1871. In 1881, Martha is housekeeper to Thomas HANNANT (HANNANT) in Great Yarmouth, and has Thomas Herbert JARVIS, age 6, with her. In 1891, Martha is recorded as Martha HANNANT, wife of Thomas HANNANT, and her son (age 16) is now Thomas HANNANT. In 1901, Thomas (jnr) appears as Thomas H. JARVIS, 26, married to Jane.
