Frederick and Ernest MADDOCKS were brothers.
Their parents were Joseph MADDOCKS, a tin
plate worker, and his wife Susan [LUNT] who
was a gold chain maker and chair maker.
Both parents were born in Birmingham

It may be that disaster struck the HANCY family in the 1870s. There is a possible death for the mother
in 1880, June qtr, Yarmouth reg-district, Harriett HANCY, age 35.

I cannot locate any of the family for certain in the 1881 census, but there is a John HANCY, age 11,
born Bungay, in Wangford Union Workhouse, Shipmeadow, in 1881. Also present are Robert HANCY, age 7,
and Eliza HANCY, age 5, both born in Bungay, who could possibly be siblings.

It is possible the father survived because in the 1901 census there is a John HANCY, age 55, born Bungay,
married to a woman called Sophia, age 40, born in Great Yarmouth. She is identified as Sophia BUSHELL
who married John HANCY in 1898 March qtr Yarmouth reg-district (GRO).

The younger John HANCY may also have been alive in 1901. He may be identified with a road labourer
of this name, age 28, born Bungay, who was boarding with a family called ADAMSON in Harrogate,
Yorkshire. If there are descendants of this HANCY family, I should be interested to hear from you.
