Not having access to Wacton registers, I am indebted to my contact Stephen Lord who told me about the marriage between Robert LORD and Jemima MEAR, and the children of this marriage. Without this key information I should not have been able to research this branch and add it to my tree.

LORD LOYD LLOYD
The ancestral name for this family was LORD according to baptismal records for earlier generations. For some branches, the spelling changed during the nineteenth century to LOYD and then LLOYD.
I have not got access to the baptismal records for Wacton or Long Stratton,

and consequently do not know how the children of Robert & Jemima LORD were recorded. They were born too early to have civil birth registrations which began in the 3rd quarter of 1837.
In censuses, they appear mostly as LOYD for early ones, and LLOYD for later ones. I have chosen to use the name LOYD for these siblings on this chart.

In the church record for the marriage of George to Sophia BANHAM his name was George LORD (1808 IGI).
In the civil record for the marriage of Henry to Susan GOODRUM his name was Henry LLOYD (1840 GRO).
See also the note attached to Diana DYE (to the right).

Susan's marriage record (1840 GRO) has the spelling GOODRUM, but other records have the spellings GOODRAM or GOODERHAM for her family.

Censuses give Charles's wife as Diana (or Dinah in 1861), born around 1905 in Wacton. An entry on Rootsweb from a contributor calling herself "Diana", and researching surname DYE in the Wacton/Tivetshall area reads: "Diana DYE m Charles LORD 29 - 1 - 1835 Wacton"
This is my sole reason for believing Charles's wife to have been Diana DYE. There is a birth of Diana DYE in Wacton on 18 Sep 1800 to parents Green DYE and Mary [SHIBLEY] in the IGI. This could be the right person.

Emily's parents were James HARDY, a farm labourer born in Hempnall, and his wife Phoebe, born in Tasburgh.
In 1861, at age 19, Emily gave birth to her son Daniel HARDY. Later that year, she married her first husband William LOVEDAY. Subsequently she had 4 children named LOVEDAY, all born in Tasburgh, who were
Betsy LOVEDAY (1865),
William Arthur LOVEDAY (1867),
Emma LOVEDAY (1869),
Priscilla LOVEDAY (1871).
In the 1871 census, Priscilla is recorded as being 3 weeks old, while Emily is widowed. There is a death of a William LOVEDAY recorded in Depwade reg-district (which includes the village of Tasburgh) in the first quarter of 1870, but that William was age 80 when he died. In any case, if this was Emily's husband, he cannot have been Priscilla's father if she was 3 weeks old on census day 1871 (which was 2nd April).

LORD LOYD LLOYD
For this branch I have used the surname spelling entered in the GRO birth record, followed by the GRO marriage spelling (in brackets) where that is different.

Belinda and John were first cousins. John's father James LOYD was brother of Belinda's father Charles. See also BULLEN chart (c1).
